

## Vijay Prashad

Vijay Prashad is an Indian historian and journalist. Professor of International Studies and George and Martha Kellner Chair of South Asia History at Trinity College, Prashad was the director of Trinity's International Studies Program for over a decade and was the founding co-director of the Trinity Institute for Interdisciplinary Studies. In 2013, he was the Edward Said Chair at the American University of Beirut, where he remains a Senior Research Fellow at the Issam Fares Institute for Public Policy. He is the author of fifteen books, two of them picked by the *Village Voice* as books of the year, and ten edited volumes. As a journalist, he writes regularly for *The Hindu* (India), *Frontline* (India), *BirGün* (Turkey) and *Alternet* (USA) and appears regularly on *The Real News Network* and *Democracy Now*. He is the Chief Editor of LeftWord Books (New Delhi). He has appeared in two films – *Shadow World* (2016) and *Two Meetings* (2017).
